

Barbara Dorsey Domer

Barbara Dorsey Domer was appointed by Governor Larry Hogan to the Maryland State Commission on Criminal Sentencing Policy on August 19, 2015. On June 30, 2016, Mrs. Domer retired as the Court Administrator for the Circuit Court for Frederick County, after joining the Court in 2003. Previously, she served 27 years with the Frederick Police Department, retiring as a Lieutenant.

While with the Frederick Police Department, she progressed through each rank and various divisions, ultimately becoming responsible for leading the Frederick Police Department to accreditation through the Commission for the Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). During her tenure as the Court Administrator, Mrs. Domer served as a member of the Conference of Circuit Court Administrators, serving as the Chair (2013–2015) and Vice-Chair (2011-2013). She was the ex-officio member of the Judicial Council, Maryland Judicial Conference, and Maryland Access to Justice Commission (2013-2015) and Conference of Circuit Court Judges (2013-2014). Mrs. Domer also served on the Alternative Dispute Resolution Committee (2011–2015).

Mrs. Domer received her MA from Hood College in Administration and Management and is a graduate of the FBI's National Academy, 183rd Session. She received a BA from University of Maryland in Law Enforcement and Criminology and an AA from Frederick Community College in Secretarial Science. As an added resource, she maintains membership with the National Association of Court Management (NACM), the Mid-Atlantic Association for Court Management (MAACM), the FBI National Academy Associates (FBINAA) and Maryland Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA).
