“Submitted” Stamp Added to Worksheet PDF

- Effective October 1, 2019, once a worksheet has been submitted in the Maryland Automated Guidelines System (MAGS), a **SUBMITTED** stamp along with the date of submission appears in the lower right corner of the worksheet PDF (see sample worksheet below). This notation was added to the worksheet in response to requests from practitioners to include an indicator signifying that the PDF or hard copy of the worksheet is the official version that has also been electronically submitted. Note that the submitted stamp and corresponding submission date only appear on the worksheet after the user clicks the "Submit" button on the *Departure/Submit* tab in MAGS.
