

### CHARACTERISTICS OF INDIVIDUALS SENTENCED FOR CHILD ABUSE FY 2018-FY 2022












<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>†</sup> Effective October 1, 2017, child physical abuse, 1<sup>st</sup> degree, carries a statutory maximum penalty of life imprisonment if the offense results in the death of a victim less than 13 years old or the sentenced individual has a previous conviction for child abuse.










#### **DISPOSITION TYPE**



\* Includes offenses resulting in death

- Child sexual abuse was more likely than all person offenses to be disposed of via a jury trial and to involve a departure above or below the guidelines.
- Child physical abuse, 1st degree sentences were more likely than all person offense sentences to involve a departure above or below the guidelines.
- Child physical abuse, 2nd degree sentences were more likely than all person offense sentences to involve a departure below the guidelines.
